assist the commission of suicide by another, he aids or attempts to aid the other to commit or attempt to commit suicide.

How can I be charged with Aiding Suicide?

You can be charged with *Aiding Suicide* if the state's attorneys believe that each of the elements of 22.08(a) as described in the <u>section above</u> have been met.


In addition to *Aiding Suicide*,here are many other laws in Texas regarding suicide. [2]

What is the **punishment** for Aiding Suicide?

A conviction for Aiding Suicide is punished as a Class C misdemeanor, [3] with a maximum possible fine under Texas state law of up to \$500, unless you actually caused a suicide or serious bodily injury (from an attempted suicide), in which case a conviction for Aiding Suicide is punished as a State Jail Felony, [4] with a maximum possible fine under Texas state law of up to \$10,000 and jail time of up to two years.
